Abdominal Assessment - ✓ ✓ ✓ ANSWER- ✓ ✓ Inspect, auscultate, percuss, palpate. Feel for lumps, masses or tenderness

Tertiary - ✓ ✓ ANSWER- ✓ ✓ begins after illness is diagnosed and treatment. Aims to prevent long-term consequences of chronic illnesses or disabilities

Modified- clear liquid, pureed, mechanically altered

Tuberculosis Pharmacological Treatment - Nursing Considerations

Isoniazid - ✓ ✓ ✓ ANSWER- ✓ ✓ TB prevention

Isoniazid- assess liver function weekly and Stevens Johnson syndrome, toxic epidermal necrosis, mental status

Don't skip dose. Keep scheduled appts.

Report weakness, fatigue, loss of appetite

Urinary System Assessment - Indwelling Catheter Assessment & Care - ✓ ✓ ✓ ANSWER- ✓ ✓ ✓ sterile technique while collecting speciment

Retract skin to expose glans (men)/seperate the labia

clean the area of meatus with soap and water

pt void about 30 mL into the toilet and pt void the remaining 10 mL into the sterile container

return foreskin to normal position

Wounds and Pressure Injuries - Types by Definition

Open - ✓ ✓ ✓ ANSWER- ✓ ✓ ✓ An open wound occurs from intentional or unintentional trauma. Skin surface is broken, Examples include incisions and abrasions.

Abdominal Assessment - ✓ ✓ ✓ ANSWER- ✓ ✓ ✓ Inspect, palpate, auscultate. Nurse assess lumps, masses or tenderness

Abnormal lung sounds: Crackles - ✓ ✓ ✓ ANSWER-✓ ✓ ✓ coarse(low pitch, wet sound)

fine (high pitch, doesn't clear w/cough, crackling of fire sound) CONDITION:RESPIRATORY EDEMA/OBSTRUCTIVE DISEASE

Abnormal lung sounds: Pleural Friction Rub - ✓ ✓ ANSWER✓ ✓ Pleural friction rub (low pitch, harsh grating sound)

Abnormal lung sounds: Rhonchi - ANSWER- Iow-heard mainly in expiration when pt is breathing out (made up of one sound-whistle or whine and high pitch, musical instrument sound MULTIPLE sounds- mainly heard in expiration CONDITION: PNEUMONIA

abnormal lung sounds: stridor - ✓ ✓ ✓ ANSWER- ✓ ✓ ✓ airway obstruction, high pitch whispering or gas (CROUP, EMERGENCY, EPIGLOTTIS)

Acid Base Balance - Arterial Blood Gas Examples -

Acute wounds -
ANSWERSuch as surgical incisions, usually heal within days to weeks. Acute wounds usually progress through the healing process without interruption.
