

A network of providers that contract to provide health services to a group of people -

Helps residents socialize and stay active - ✓✓✓ ANSWER- ✓✓✓ Activities Director

Licensed professional who has completed 1/2 years of edu. and is able to administer meds and give treatments - ✓✓✓ ANSWER- ✓✓✓ LPN / LVN

Helps residents get support services, such as counseling - ✓✓✓ ANSWER- ✓✓✓ Medical Social Worker

Performs assigned tasks, such as vitals, personal care, and reporting observations to other care members - ✓✓✓ ANSWER- ✓✓✓ Nursing Assistant

Helps residents learn to adapt to disabilities by training residents to perform ADLs and other activities - ✓✓✓ ANSWER- ✓✓✓ Occupational Therapist

Administers therapy in the form of heat, cold, massage, ultrasound, electrical stimulation, and exercise muscles, bones, and joints - ✓✓✓ ANSWER- ✓✓✓ Physical Therapist

Diagnose disease or disability and prescribes treatment - ✓✓✓ ANSWER- ✓✓✓ Physician or doctor

Creates diets for residents with special needs - ✓✓✓ ANSWER- ✓✓✓ registered dietitian

Licensed professional who has graduated from a two- to four year nursing program and coordinates, manages, and provides skilled nursing care - ✓✓✓ ANSWER- ✓✓✓ Registered nurse
