Domains for Nursing Interventions - ✓✓ANSWER✓✓-Helping teaching

Diagnostic and patient monitoring

administering and monitoring therapeutic interventions

quality of health care practices

Standard interventions - ✓✓ANSWER✓✓-•Allow nurses to act more quickly and appropriately

•Help capture patient care information that can be shared across disciplines and care settings

Standing orders - ✓✓ANSWER✓✓-a preprinted document containing orders for the conduct of routine therapies, monitoring guidelines, and/or diagnostic procedures for specific patients with identified clinical problems

Care bundle - ✓✓ANSWER✓✓-group of interventions related to a disease process or condition

Clinical practice guidelines and protocols are an example of - ✓✓ANSWER✓✓-standard interventions

Clinical practice guidelines and protocols are - ✓✓ANSWER✓✓-A systemically developed set of statements about appropriate health care for specific health care problems or clinical solutions

Standards of practice - ✓✓ANSWER✓✓-Nurses use the ANA Standards of Professional Nursing Practice as evidence of the standard of care provided to patients

Review all possible consequences associated with each possible nursing action

Determine the probability of all possible consequences

Judge the value of the consequence to the patient

Preventing complications - ✓✓ANSWER✓✓-Identify risks to the patient

Adapt interventions to the situation

Evaluate the relative benefit of a treatment vs. the risk

Initiate risk-prevention measures

Identifying areas of assistance - ✓✓ANSWER✓✓-Seek information about a procedure

Collect all necessary equipment

Consider consequences of the procedures

Ask another nurse provide assistance and guidance

ADLs (activities of daily living) - ✓✓ANSWER✓✓-Direct care measures usually performed during a normal day - feeding, toileting, dressing

IADLs (instrumental ADLs) - ✓✓ANSWER✓✓-Activities that support daily life and are oriented toward integrating with the environment - shopping, home maintenance, prepping meals

Physical care techniques - ✓✓ANSWER✓✓-turning and positioning, inserting a feeding tube, administering medications, and providing comfort measures

Life saving measures - ✓✓ANSWER✓✓-CPR, intervening for the confused
