The purpose of advance directives is to - ✓✓✓-outline the client's wishes if he becomes unresponsive.

- Can be changed at any time.

- Client's partner does not need to be present if the client comes unresponsive. The nurse should place a copy of the client's advance directives on the medical record so the client's wishes are clear.

The client's clinical pathway is - ✓✓✓-a standardized approach to assist the nurse to provide cost-effective client care and shorten length of stay.

Wheeled chairs create a safety hazard for the client because - ✓✓✓-he may fall while sitting and rising from the chair, especially while managing oxygen equipment.

How to verify a client has given informed consent. - ✓✓✓-The nurse should ask the client to explain the procedure that is being performed. This allows the nurse to verify the client's understanding of the information provided by the provider prior to witnessing the client's signature on the consent form.

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Performing basic CPR is within the AP's scope of practice. - ✓✓✓-T

According to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention, \_\_\_\_\_ is a nationally notifiable infectious disease in all 51 jurisdictions. The nurse should notify the state health department, which monitors and controls communicable diseases. - ✓✓✓-chlamydia trachomatis

Above the knee amputation dressing is usually left in place for - ✓✓✓-48 to 72 hr

mechanical restraints - ✓✓✓-- nurse should assess and document every 15 min for range of motion, circulation, and psychological status.

- provider should evaluate the client within 1 hr of initiation.

- nurse should constantly observe a client who is in mechanical restraints.

Beneficence is - ✓✓✓-an ethical principle in which the nurse's actions are taken to "do good" and promote goodness and kindness.

Utility is - ✓✓✓-an ethical principle in which the nurse's actions are taken to bring the most to the greatest number of people, where the good of many will outweigh the needs of an individual client.

Justice is - ✓✓✓-an ethical principle in which the nurse's actions are taken to seek fairness, where all clients are treated equally regardless of gender, sexual orientation, religion, ethnicity, disease, or social standing.

Fidelity is - ✓✓✓-an ethical principle in which the nurse's actions are enacted by being loyal and keeping a promise made to the client.

The nurse should verify that the client has given informed consent prior to receiving moderate sedation because - ✓✓✓-this is a procedure which requires anesthesia.

When should a nurse use critical pathway? - ✓✓✓-The nurse should use a critical pathway as a cost-effective strategy to guide care for clients who have a specific medical diagnosis or are undergoing a specific procedure.

When should a nurse use incident reporting? - ✓✓✓-The nurse should complete an incident report as part of error reporting and quality improvement; however, this action does not relate to management of the client's care.

When should a nurse use SBAR framework - ✓✓✓-The nurse should use the SBAR framework to identify the situation, background, assessment, and recommendation for a specific circumstance. The nurse can focus on the client's immediate circumstances to promote clinical decision making.

When should a nurse use root cause analysis? - ✓✓✓-The nurse should use root cause analysis during the quality control process to determine why a standard is not being met.

RACE nursing - ✓✓✓-RESCUE, ALARM, CONFINE, EXTINGUISH/EVACUATE.

What does the nurse manager do when a nurse is sent home due to being under the influence? - ✓✓✓-Once the nurse manager has removed the nurse from the work environment and arranged for safe transportation home, the nurse manager should arrange to meet with the nurse within the next 24 hours. The nurse manager is to confront the nurse who was chemically impaired and clearly identify the facility's expectations.
